Facelift a combined effort

A NEW area is being developed at Hobart's Elizabeth College to create a place for students to use in breaks.

Located between the canteen and D Block, it is already a popular spot for students; one that is great for meeting up with people and for socialising.

"There will be a focus on landscaping, with a lot more greenery helping to provide an even more calming and relaxing atmosphere. It will have

colourful, easily moveable furniture that can be changed to suit social groups of all sizes and there will be more areas under cover.

Elizabeth College principal Dianne Purnell says the redevelopment will be a great asset for the school.

"What we hope it will do is give them [students] a much more relaxed environment — something a bit more green, with trees, plants and some comfortable seating," Dr Purnell said.

"The college wants to have some-

where that all the students could go to in break times — somewhere where everyone feels comfortable."

Elizabeth College students and parents are contributing to the project, with a number of classes taking part in the work.

Woodwork students are going to be a big part of the development, especially the first stage which involves moving the groundsmen's shed to a more appropriate place.

Another class is going to be looking

at building materials, particularly metal, to find the most appropriate, long lasting product.

The Housing and Design class will be looking at the space that is used and coming up with their own ideas of how they would use the area.

They will also be involved in the finer details of the design; things such as picking out the pots for plants, what plants should be in the pots, and where things should be placed.

It is planned that the Access to

Work and Training class will also play a part in redeveloping this area; from painting to putting down pavers, they will be doing some of the manual labour around the area.

STUDENTS at Elizabeth College are given full support to become inspired resourceful leaders.

Four students attended a leadership conference at the Hotel Grand Chancellor on March 26, along with others from schools and colleges all over southern Tasmania.

"The program gave me a new outlook on leadership and how I can be a valid student of Elizabeth College [and] gave me the necessary skills to be a great leader and guided me towards my leadership goals at school," participant Tom Warrington said.

The college also participates in the Tasmania Youth Parliament each September, where students form a "government" and "opposition" to debate current issues.

"Having the opportunity to participate in the program, tackling issues normally dealt with by qualified adults is the most uplifting and inspirational thing," 2012 participant Kathryn Ellis said.
